Macau - SAR (Ages 13-15) Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS)



FACT SHEET

The Macau - SAR GYTS includes data on prevalence of cigarette and other tobacco use as well as information on five determinants of tobacco use: access/availability and price, exposure to secondhand smoke (SHS), cessation, media and advertising, and school curriculum. These determinants are components Macau - SAR could include in a comprehensive tobacco control program.

The Macau - SAR GYTS was a school-based survey of students in grade 6 and forms 1 through 3 conducted in 2001.

A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce representative data for all of Macau - SAR. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 90.5%, the class response rate was 100%, the student response rate was 94.6%, and the overall response rate was 85.6%. A total of 1,108 students aged 13-15 participated in the Macau - SAR GYTS.

Prevalence

27.8% of students had ever smoked cigarettes (Boy = 32.0%, Girl = 23.1%)

7.6% currently use any tobacco product (Boy = 9.0%, Girl = 5.9%)

7.0% currently smoke cigarettes (Boy = 8.1%, Girl = 5.6%)

1.2% currently use other tobacco products (Boy = 2.0%, Girl = 0.4%)

11.6% of never smokers are likely to initiate smoking next year

Knowledge and Attitudes

14.2% think boys and 10.3% think girls who smoke have more friends 12.9% think boys and 6.3% think girls who smoke look more attractive

Access and Availability - Current Smokers

8.9% usually smoke at home 43.4% buy cigarettes in a store

Exposure to Secondhand Smoke (SHS)

39.0% live in homes where others smoke in their presence

60.4% are around others who smoke in places outside their home

58.1% think smoking should be banned from public places

71.2% think smoke from others is harmful to them

55.4% have one or more parents who smoke

8.5% have most or all friends who smoke

Cessation - Current Smokers

53.7% want to stop smoking

61.8% tried to stop smoking during the past year

Media and Advertising

83.6% saw anti-smoking media messages, in the past 30 days

83.5% saw pro-cigarette ads on billboards, in the past 30 days

58.9% saw pro-cigarette ads in newspapers or magazines, in the past 30 days

18.0% have an object with a cigarette brand logo

6.4% were offered free cigarettes by a tobacco company representative

School

82.0% had been taught in class, during the past year, about the dangers of smoking

26.0% had discussed in class, during the past year, reasons why people their age smoke

76.0% had been taught in class, during the past year, the effects of tobacco use

Highlights

- 7.6% of students currently use any form of tobacco; 7% currently smoke cigarettes; 1.2% currently use some other form of tobacco.
- SHS exposure is high almost 4 in 10 students live in homes where others smoke in their presence, and 6 in 10 students are exposed to smoke around others outside of the home; Over half have one or more parents who smoke.
- More than 7 in 10 students think smoke from others is harmful to them.
- Close to 6 in 10 students think smoking in public places should be banned.
- Over half the smokers want to stop smoking.
- Approximately 1 in 6 students has an object with a cigarette brand logo on it.
- Over 8 in 10 students saw antismoking media messages in the past 30 days; Close to threequarters of the students saw procigarette ads in the past 30 days.
