Thailand (Ages 13-15) Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS)



FACT SHEET

The Thailand GYTS includes data on prevalence of cigarette and other tobacco use as well as information on five determinants of tobacco use: access/availability and price, exposure to secondhand smoke (SHS), cessation, media and advertising, and school curriculum. These determinants are components Thailand could include in a comprehensive tobacco control program.

The Thailand GYTS was a school-based survey of students in Mathayom 1 through 5 conducted in 2005.

A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce representative data for Thailand. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 100.0%, the class response rate was 100.0%, the student response rate was 99.9%, and the overall response rate was 99.9%. A total of 15,420 students aged 13-15 participated in the Thailand GYTS.

Prevalence

26.7% of students had ever smoked cigarettes (Boy = 37.9%, Girl = 15.1%)

15.7% currently use any tobacco product (Boy = 21.7%, Girl = 8.4%)

11.7% currently smoke cigarettes (Boy = 17.4%, Girl = 4.8%)

7.7% currently use other tobacco products (Boy = 10.4%, Girl = 4.9%)

10.0% of never smokers are likely to initiate smoking next year

Knowledge and Attitudes

36.0% think boys and 14.6% think girls who smoke have more friends 11.6% think boys and 5.8% think girls who smoke look more attractive

Access and Availability - Current Smokers

19.2% usually smoke at home

38.1% buy cigarettes in a store

28.3% who bought cigarettes in a store were NOT refused purchase because of their age

Exposure to Secondhand Smoke (SHS)

49.0% live in homes where others smoke in their presence

68.2% are around others who smoke in places outside their home

88.1% think smoking should be banned from public places

68.6% think smoke from others is harmful to them

47.9% have one or more parents who smoke

8.1% have most or all friends who smoke

Cessation - Current Smokers

72.3% want to stop smoking

83.3% tried to stop smoking during the past year

89.2% have ever received help to stop smoking

Media and Advertising

91.9% saw anti-smoking media messages, in the past 30 days

42.0% have an object with a cigarette brand logo

10.2% were offered free cigarettes by a tobacco company representative

School

61.9% had been taught in class, during the past year, about the dangers of smoking 30.7% had discussed in class, during the past year, reasons why people their age smoke 59.9% had been taught in class, during the past year, the effects of tobacco use

Highlights

- 15.7% of students currently use any form of tobacco; 11.7% currently smoke cigarettes; 7.7% currently use some other form of tobacco.
- SHS exposure is high half the students live in homes where others smoke, and over two-thirds of the students are exposed to smoke around others outside of the home; more than 2 in 5 students have at least one parent who smokes.
- Seven in 10 students think smoke from others is harmful to them.
- Nine in 10 students think smoking in public places should be banned.
- Over 7 in 10 current smokers want to stop smoking.
- More than 2 in 5 students have an object with a cigarette brand logo on it.
- Over 9 in 10 students saw antismoking media messages in the past 30 days.
